A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING SATURDAY, JULY 19, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WE, considering that, with a view to the more wide-spread and general celebration of the Conclusion of Peace, it is desirable that Saturday, the Nineteenth day of July instant, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and in pursuance of the provisions of The Bank Holidays Act, 1871, The Holidays Extension Act, 1875, The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and The Revenue Offices (Scotland) Holidays Act, 1880, Do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Saturday, the Nineteenth day of July instant, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day

to be so observed, and all Our loving Subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Eleventh day of *July*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Tenth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of June, 1919, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable

in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing date the 29th October, 1914, the 10th January, 1917, the 13th March, 1917, and the 19th May, 1917, Colour Sergeants of Royal Marines borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships are placed in Class II. of the Navy Separation Allowance Scale:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that these Non-Commissioned Officers should be placed in Class III. of that Scale:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the amendment of the Scale accordingly with effect from the 3rd April, 1919.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

like manner as if they were mentioned in the said Schedule:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that the new Denominations of Standards set forth in the Schedule hereto, being multiples of the Imperial measure of one gallon, ascertained by the said Act, are required, in addition to the Denominations of Standards mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act:

And whereas the Board of Trade have caused the said new Denominations of Standards to be made and duly verified:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve the several Denominations of Standards set forth in the Schedule hereto as new Denominations of Standards, and doth direct that the same, on and after the first day of August, 1919, shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1878.

WHEREAS by the Weights and Measures Act, 1904, it is (among other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of weights, measures, and weighing and measuring instruments, in substitution for the fees specified in the First Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1889, and that any Order in Council so made may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 19th day of July, 1918, directed that the fees specified in the Schedule to that Order should be taken in substitution for the fees specified in the Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1907:

And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient to vary the said Order in Council of the 19th day of July, 1918, and to substitute new fees to be taken in respect of the verification and stamping by Inspectors of Weights and Measures of the measures mentioned in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it has been made to appear that the fees specified in the Schedule hereto are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the fees specified in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be taken accordingly in substitution for the fees specified in the Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 19th day of July, 1918.

This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1919.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parish of Denbigh in the County of Denbigh now vested in us:

“Whereas under and by virtue of the two indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the schedule hereunder written, the lands tenements and hereditaments situate in the Parish of Denbigh aforesaid, and particularly described in the same indentures and schedule became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us:

“And whereas none of the said lands tenements and hereditaments are subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

“And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said

lands tenements and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands tenements and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands tenements and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said indentures or either of them with their appurtenances and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England:

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament:

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Trevethin, in the County of Monmouth, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, on the 24th June, 1919, make a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Aber-sychan, in the County of Monmouth, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials

should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz. :—

ABERSYCHAN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. Cadoc, Trevechin, and in that portion of the Churchyard attached thereto that was in existence prior to 1827; Provided that—

(a) In the vault now existing in the said Church and belonging or reputed to belong to John Capel Hanbury, and in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 18th day of August next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 18th day of August.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, Oxford, on the 9th day of June, 1919, and sealed on the 5th day of July, 1919, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did, by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners, who are therein described as "The College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved by her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1881, and have since been altered and amended from time to time.

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of our said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 9th day of June, 1919, it was resolved by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting at the Meeting, that the further alterations in and additions to the said Statutes which are hereinafter specified should be made, that is to say:—

In Statute III (April 1913 Edition as amended by Statutes made by the College on the 13th day of June and the 28th day of October, 1916, respectively, and approved by Orders in Council on the 13th day of March and the 13th day of June, 1917, respectively).

That in Statute III there shall be inserted immediately after Clause 10 thereof, the clause following (that is to say):—

" 11. The Warden and Fellows may, from time to time, elect without examination, to a Fellowship with the aforesaid emolument, any person who, having been a Fellow of the College, or being in the judgment of the Warden and Fellows, qualified by character and attainments to be a Fellow of the College, undertakes to perform some definite educational work

(a) in giving instruction in connection with higher or advanced studies in the University; or

(b) under the Tutorial Classes Committee of the Delegacy for the Extension of University Teaching beyond the limits of the University:

which work shall always be combined with some definite line of independent investigation or research, which together with such work shall be specified in the resolution by which the Fellow is elected, but such work, investigation, or research may be varied from time to time by the Warden and Fellows. Any such Fellow shall be at liberty to undertake work in connection with the education of Undergraduate Students in the University in the subjects specified in such resolution or in any such variation as aforesaid, and to such extent only as the Warden and Fellows may from time to time determine.

Any person elected under this clause shall reside within the University during such period in each academical year as the Warden and Fellows shall from time to time determine. He shall hold his Fellowship until the expiration of five years from the day of his election or until he ceases to perform the work specified in the resolution by which he is elected or in any subsequent resolution, whichever shall first happen. Every such Fellow, on the expiration or sooner determination of his Fellowship, shall be eligible for re-election in like manner and under the same conditions.

In addition to the emoluments of his Fellowship, every such Fellow shall receive £300 per annum, for the work and investigation or research to be done by him, as specified in the resolution by which he is elected, or in any subsequent resolution, and for the purposes of Statute X, Clause 11, of these Statutes the said sum of £300 per annum shall be deemed to be part of his emoluments

as Fellow. The number of such Fellows shall not exceed five at any one time.

The exercise by the Warden and Fellows of the powers conferred by this clause shall be subject to the provisions of Statute VII." That in Statute III, Clause 14, the number "XIII" shall be substituted for the number "XII."

That in Statute III, Clause 17, the figures 12, 13 and 16 shall be substituted for the figures 11, 12 and 15, and in Clause 20 the figures 13 shall be substituted for the figures 12.

That Clauses 11 to 22 of Statute III shall be re-numbered as Clauses 12 to 23.

In Statute IV (April 1913 Edition as amended by Statutes made by the College on the 13th day of May, 1913 and the 13th day of June, 1916, respectively, and approved by Orders in Council on the 14th day of May, 1914 and the 13th day of March, 1917, respectively).

That in Statute IV, Clause 3, the number xiii shall be substituted for the number xii.

IN STATUTES VI-XII (April 1913 Edition).

That after Statute VI there shall be inserted the following new Statute:—"VII 1. Subject to the Charges imposed or authorized by the foregoing Statutes (other than Statute III, Clause 11) there shall be payable out of the Revenues of the College appropriated to the purposes of these Statutes:—

"(i) To a Lecturer in The Conflict of Laws (Private International Law) the annual sum of £300;

"(ii) To the Drummond Professor of Political Economy the annual sum of £400, in addition to the sum payable to him under the foregoing provisions of these Statutes;

"(iii) To the Gladstone Professor of Political Theory and Institutions the annual sum of £200, in addition to the sum payable to him under the foregoing provisions of these Statutes;

"(iv) To the Professor of Economic History (in the event of the establishment of a Professorship in that subject) the annual sum of £300, together with the yearly sum of £200, as the emolument of a Fellowship held by him in the College;

"(v) To a Lecturer or Lecturers, to be called Chichele Lecturers (to be appointed by the Warden and Fellows) who shall deliver a special course or courses of lectures in such subjects connected with the studies of Law History Political Theory or Economics as the Warden and Fellows, after considering any representation from the Hebdomadal Council, shall determine, the sum of £100 for each such course;

"(vi) To the Professor of Economic History an additional annual sum of £400;

"(vii) To a Professor or Reader (in the event of such Professorship or Readership being established) in some subject connected with the studies of Political Theory or Economics, the yearly sum of £300, together with the yearly sum of £200, as the emolument of a Fellowship held by him in the College;

"(viii) Towards the maintenance of the Bodleian Library an additional yearly sum not exceeding £1,000.

"2. In providing out of the Revenues of the College as they shall become available, for

the charges created or authorized by this Statute and by Statute III, Clause 11, the following order of priority shall (as amongst such charges respectively) be observed, so far as may be:—

"(1) Charges (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) shall be, and Charge (v) and the charges for not more than two Fellowships under Statute III Clause 11, may be provided for, and brought into operation, in priority to Charges (vi), (vii) and (viii), and to the charges for the remaining three Fellowships under Statute III, Clause 11, and (as amongst themselves) in such order as the Warden and Fellows may from time to time determine.

"(2) Charges (vi), (vii) and (viii) and the charges for the remaining three Fellowships under Statute III, Clause 11, shall be provided for, and brought into operation (as amongst themselves) in such order as the Warden and Fellows may from time to time determine.

The provisions of this Statute for Charges (iv), (vi) and (vii) shall only take effect on the condition that the election or appointment of each of the several Professors or Readers, provided for by the same, shall be vested in a Board constituted by Statute of the University, of which two members at least shall be persons elected by the Warden and Fellows, and the provisions of this Statute for Charge (i) shall only take effect on the condition that the election or appointment of the Lecturer provided for thereby shall be vested in an Electoral Board consisting of the Chichele Professor of International Law, the Vinerian Professor of English law, a person elected by the Warden and Fellows, a person elected by the Board of the Faculty of Law, and the Chairman for the time being of the Council of Legal Education appointed by the Inns of Court."

That Statutes VII to XII shall be re-numbered as Statutes VIII to XIII.

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of our said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 10th day of June, 1919, it was unanimously resolved by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the further alterations in and additions to the said Statutes, which are hereinafter specified, should be made, that is to say:—

IN STATUTE VII (April 1913 Edition).

That in Statute VII there shall be inserted immediately after Clause 6 thereof the Clause following, that is to say:—

"7. The Warden and Fellows may from time to time, by a Resolution of a Stated General Meeting, grant to any retiring Officer or Chaplain of the College who shall have held his Office or Chaplaincy, or successively and without interruption (no period less than a consecutive period of one year being reckoned as an interruption) two or more of such Offices or Chaplaincies, for a period of not less than twenty years before attaining the age of sixty-five years, or such later age as the Warden and Fellows may for any special reason determine in any case, a pension of an amount not exceeding one half of his emoluments as such Officer or Chaplain when he vacated his Office or Chaplaincy. For the purposes of this Clause his emoluments shall be deemed to include the emoluments of any Fellowship held by him as such Officer or Chaplain.

"No pension shall be granted under the powers of this clause, nor shall any such pension continue to be paid, to any person to whom a pension shall have been granted, either under the powers of these Statutes or otherwise, upon his retirement from any Professorship in the University.

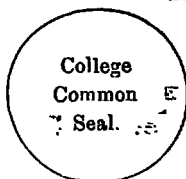
The Warden and Fellows may, if they think fit, set apart out of the Revenues of the College appropriated to the purposes of these Statutes an annual sum to form a Pension Fund for the payment of pensions to College Officers and Chaplains. The formation of this fund (if any) and its application shall (subject to the provisions of these Statutes) be regulated by By-laws to be made by the Warden and Fellows."

That Clauses 7 and 8 of Statute VII shall be re-numbered as Clauses 8 and 9.

Now, we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in and to the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

RULE MADE BY THE RULE COMMITTEE OF THE SUPREME COURT WITH REFERENCE TO THE CLOSING OF THE SUPREME COURT AND THE OFFICES THEREOF ON THE 19TH JULY, 1919.

We, the Rule Committee of the Supreme Court hereby make the following Rules:—

(1) It shall not be necessary for the Court of Appeal or the High Court of Justice to sit on Saturday, the 19th day of July, 1919, being the day appointed to be kept as a public holiday throughout the United Kingdom for the purpose of celebrating the conclusion of the War.

(2) The several offices of the Supreme Court shall be closed on the said Saturday, 19th July.

(3) These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (Peace Celebration) Rules, 1919.

And we, the said Rule Committee, hereby certify that on account of urgency these Rules should come into immediate operation, and we make these Rules to come into operation forthwith as provisional Rules.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATION 14A.

By an Order dated the 5th July the Home Secretary has, on the recommendation of the Admiralty, revoked the Order of the 5th June, 1916 (made under Defence of the Realm Regulation 14A), which imposed restrictions upon persons proceeding to or from ports in the Orkney Islands. It is no longer necessary for travellers who may wish to proceed to the Orkneys to obtain permits from the Officer Commanding Troops, Lerwick.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Trumpeter Mangal Sain, 2nd Lancers, Indian Army.

On the 15th March last, while some Turkish prisoners-of-war were bathing at Beirut under a guard of British soldiers, one of them got into difficulties. Two members of the escort went to his assistance but failed to rescue him. On hearing of the man's danger, Mangal Sain at once swam out through the surf and eventually with great difficulty brought him ashore.

Shortly afterwards two British soldiers who were bathing were seen to have been caught in a current and to be in danger of drowning, and Mangal Sain, although still exhausted on account of his rescue of the first man, again swam out to the assistance of the two others. He succeeded in bringing one man ashore, and, although he was completely done up, he immediately started without hesitation to the rescue of the other soldier. He was, however, called back, as it was seen that the man had drifted so far out that it was impossible to save him.

Both men who were rescued were in the last state of collapse and must inevitably have been drowned had it not been for the gallantry displayed by Mangal Sain, who incurred great risk in rendering the services, owing to the violent surf and the dangerous currents beyond.
