WHEREAS it is provided by section six of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, that if a resolution has been passed by both Houses of Parliament for the suspension of that Act, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to suspend the operation of that Act to such extent and for such period, definite or indefinite, as may be specified in the resolution:

And whereas a resolution has been passed by both Houses of Parliament for suspending the operation of Sections 1, 2 and 5 of the said Act on and after the tenth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, until His Majesty shall revoke any Order in Council which He may be pleased to make for giving effect to this resolution:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Commission, dated the 17th day of March, 1925, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness The Prince Henry, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince Henry, His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, being authorised thereto by His Majesty's said Commission in pursuance of the said section, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council on His Majesty's behalf are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the operation of Sections 1, 2, and 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, shall be suspended on and after the tenth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, until His Majesty shall be pleased to revoke this Order.
