And We do further Direct, That in all Protections the Persons be not only Named, but Described by their Place of Residence, and Implyment, and Service for which they are Protected. And that if any of the said Persons shall be found upon the Water, in any other Service than what they are Protected for, they shall be limited to be Impress, except the Watermen belonging to Us, Our most Dear Confort, the Navy-Board, Ordnance, Vietualling, Custons, and Transsportation.
